STANDARIZING?

- Is the process of development of a standard for written and/or oral language.
- It depends on the community and the social, historical and geographic aspects involved ("language standarisation is very much a social process, and it is powered by people")
- At a certain point usually there is a prescriptive effort to develop a standard

Language Planning

- Selection: Choosing the variety to be an official language
- **Codification**: Standardizing its structural/linguistics features elaboration of grammars, dictionaries and written models.
- Elaboration: Extending its functions for its use in new domains
 all aspects of social life.
- **Implementation**: attempts by the government to encourage use of the standard.
- Acceptance: the population use and think of it as the national language.
