10 Fix-Up Strategies For Reading Comprehension



- 1. Make a CONNECTION (text-to-self; text-to-world; text-to-text)
- 2. Make a PREDICTION, and continue to revisit and revise that prediction.
- 3. STOP AND THINK about what you have already read. $^{\heartsuit}$
- 4. Ask yourself a QUESTION, and try to answer it.
- 5. REFLECT IN WRITING on what you have read. \mathscr{M}
- 6. VISUALIZE.
- 7. RETELL what you have read.
- 8. REREAD. 5
- 9. Adjust your READING RATE: slow down \mathbf{O} or speed up \mathbf{O} .
- 10. Use TEXT FEATURES (pictures, captions, charts, **bolded**/italicized words) to help make predictions and clarifications.

REMEMBER:

- Good readers isolate confusion and make a plan to fix it. They know that if they continue reading without doing anything to help themselves, their confusion will get worse.
- Good readers don't quit when they become confused. They use fix-up strategies to repair confusion.
- Good readers use fix-up strategies flexibly. When one doesn't work, they try another
 one.
