Forum Presentation Instructions and Rubric

You will be invited to present in one of three forums that will take place over the course of the semester and that will cover the topics of immigration, gun control, and the #MeToo movement. For your forum presentation, you should:

- Research a credible and up-to-date source pertaining to the topic of the forum.
- Present in front of the class for 3-5 minutes concerning both 1) a summary of the information provided by the source and 2) your own opinion about the forum topic.
- Participate as a leading member of class discussion about the topic.
- Write a 2-page essay after the forum has taken place about what you learned from the forum and your opinion about the issue.

This assignment is an opportunity for students to play a more active role in contributing to and leading class discussions by practicing their research, oral communication, and writing skills.
